- 3. Represents restricted stock units awarded as part of the Company's Long Term Incentive Plan. Twenty-five percent (25%) of the total units awarded vest and are payable, solely in shares of common stock of the Company, on January 2, 2016 and on each January 2 thereafter through January 2, 2019.
- 4. Represents the conversion of restricted stock units to shares of common stock upon vesting of restricted stock units awarded as part of the Company 's Long Term Incentive Plan. Twenty-five (25%) of the total units awarded vest and are payable, solely in shares of common stock of the Company on each anniversary of the January 2, 2015 award date.
- 5. Performance Units vest and are paid at the end of the three (3) consecutive calendar year periods ending December 31, 2018 or, if earlier, upon death, disability or retirement. Performance Units are forfeited if employment is terminated before December 31, 2018 for reasons other than death, disability or retirement or by the Company without cause. Performance Units are payable solely in cash in an amount equal to the ninety (90) day trailing average price of one (1) share of the Company 's common stock determined as of December 31, 2018, or if applicable, as of the Reporting Person's death, disability or retirement.
- 6. Performance Units vest and are paid at the end of three (3) consecutive calendar year periods ending December 31, 2017 or, if earlier, upon death, disability or retirement. Performance Units are forfeited if employment is terminated before December 31, 2017 for reasons other than death, disability or retirement or by the Company without cause. Performance Units are payable solely in cash in an amount equal to the ninety (90) day trailing average price of one (1) share of the Company 's common stock determined as of December 31, 2017, or if applicable, death, disability or retirement.
- 7. Restricted stock units are forfeited if Reporting Person's service as an officer of the Company is terminated prior to age sixty (60). If service as an officer continues through age sixty (60), restricted stock units are payable solely in cash in one lump sum payment or in five (5) or ten (10) consecutive, substantially equal annual installments, whichever distribution form is elected by the Reporting Person, beginning six (6) months following termination of service. Each restricted stock unit is converted to cash in an amount equal to the fair market value (200 day rolling average) of one share of the Company's common stock on the date of termination of the Reporting Person's service as an officer of the Company.
- 8. Restricted stock units are payable solely in cash in one lump sum payment or in five (5) or ten (10) consecutive, substantially equal annual installments, whichever distribution form is elected by the Reporting Person, beginning six (6) months following termination of service as an officer of the Company. Each restricted stock unit is converted to cash in an amount equal to the fair market value (200 day rolling average) of one share of the Company's common stock on the date of termination of the Reporting Person's service as an officer of the Company.
